Those who subscribe to the Rainbow have no doubt seen the ads from FARNA Systems. Owner Frank Swygert is helping carry the Disk Basic CoCo onward into the nineties. He's got some neat hardware also, (some of it you will remember from the old days). There is a partial FARNA catalog included for your convenience.

Adding Stuff:

Some people have accused the CoCo of having the lamest excuse for a system buss ever designed into a home computer. Although it's not really that bad, there are a few problems with it.

First, it's not very robust. The CoCo2 has no buffering on the buss at all, depending on the CPU to not only drive the motherboard, but also anything plugged into it. Things are a little better in the CoCo3- not only did Tandy add a buffer on the data lines, but the internal address line fan out is smaller, leaving more power for external hardware.

The second problem lies in the decoding (or lack of it) supplied by the machine. A single hardware select is provided- one that 'selects' a space twice as large as required. With only a limited address range available for hardware, you certainly don't want to waste any. But the CoCo does just that!

There is also a single ROM select. This becomes a problem because of Tandy's insistence on designing all of it's addons to run on a tape based CoCo1. Everything they made had internal software in ROM, and these ROMs reside in the same place as Disk Basic. Even though the actual hardware in these cards has no problems co-existing with a disk controller, the 2 ROMs will conflict, and the machine crashes!

The final problem comes from using one line for 2 uses. The cart line is expected to send interrupts from hardware devices, AND autostart ROMPaks.

There have been many solutions to these problems used in the past, the most well know being the MultiPak. From an engineering standpoint, it remains the ultimate buss fix. By switching /SCS (hardware), /CTS (rom), and /CART (interrupt), between it's four slots, it solves the problem by avoiding it. You still don't have enough select lines, but you can change where the

few available go.

Historically, it's size and cost were the main thing wrong with a MultiPak. A new problem has popped up- the 'small' MPI's use a couple of custom chips which are no longer available.

Another popular alternative is the infamous Y-Cable. This approach had a few problems. First, using Tandy cards on one can be a real chore- the internal ROM must be disabled or removed. Second flaw is more insidious. The added capacitance of even a few inches of ribbon cable does terrible things to the buss timing, and crosstalk between the individual wires introduces unneeded noise. The upshot can be erratic disk operation.

An alternative MPI style expansion is available. The SlotPak only has 2 switched slots with a third unswitched. It also doesn't switch the CART line, which is great for OS9, but means no ROMPaks.

Lastly, the XPander takes a different tack. The select lines are not switched at all. Instead, the hardware select (/SCS) can be split into 2 separate ones. Software select goes either to the currently selected hardware, or always to the disk controller. If you choose, the XPander can sense a ROMPak inserted in it's single external slot, and disable the internal ones so the ROMPak can be ran. Lastly, the built in serial port is fully decoded and doesn't care what you are doing on the expansion slots.

Wish Lists-

Many things formerly available for the CoCo have become quite rare. There is a law stating the harder something is to find, the more people will want it.

A company like CoNect often obtains single examples of rare software or hardware, and it's not easy to figure out what to do with them. They can't be put in the catalog- it would be folly to list something that will be sold out 2 days after a bi-monthly catalog mails, especially if it's not likely to be replaceable soon.

So what we've done is establish a 'wish list'. If you need something that's usually not around, just drop us a line and your name will be added to one of these lists. When one becomes available, you will be contacted and given the chance to purchase it.

And that's about it for December- my turkey awaits.

You CAN take it with you! CoNect and FARNA Systems are happy to announce the first affordable LapTop style Color Computer. For about the cost of a color monitor, you can have:

- * 640x200 Display- compatible with DECB or OS9 Windowing System.
- * Expansion Slots- 2 internal slots, both can support a 'full size' card
1 external slot, you can still play Tetris on the plane!
- * Built in RS232- Doesn't take up valuable slot space. This port supports all of the common lines-TD, RD, DCD, DTR, DSR, CTS, RTS
- * 2 hour battery- Plus the PoCo can be operated from AC while the battery is charging with the included Adaptor/charger.

I can here you thinking 'That won't fit in a CoCo case!' and you are half right. The kit comes with a new lower case shell to reposition the mother-board and allow all the goodies to fit.

Options:

- * Dual RS-232- MUST be part of the initial order. This is a substitute for the original port, not an add on.
- * Internal Trackball- Mounts in the blank space to the left of the keyboard. Resolution and port used are switchable.

In addition to a 128/512K CoCo, you supply the mass storage and modem. The following configurations are possible:

Floppy Drive system:

A 3.5 inch floppy drive and it's controller mounted internally. The included drive cable provides an external connector to allow your FD-50x case to be plugged in to the PoCo at your desk, for greater storage. You will have to reconfigure the FD-xxx case as drives /d1 and /d2.

Hard Drive System:

If you have an autoboot hard drive system, the floppy can be replaced with a 3.5 inch half-height(or smaller) hard drive. The external drive connector still allows you to plug in the FD-50x case while at your desktop.

Dual Drive System:

If you have 1/3 height devices, both a floppy and a hard drive will fit.

Internal Modems:

Floppy systems, which use only one slot of the XPander, have room to mount a standard size modem card over the motherboard. Voltages available from the PoCo supply are 5,+12, and -12.

Systems that use both internal slots, like hard drive PoCo's, only have room for a 'pocket' modem placed underneath the keyboard.

What Doesn't fit:

The DISTO 1 meg upgrade will not fit. It MIGHT be possible to install one in a floppy system, but the tiny amount of disk storage available and the extra power drain make it impractical.

The Burke & Burke hard drive system will take a bit of hacking. The XT type controller is just a bit wide to plug and go.

You must have a totallt still image, as the digitizing process takes about 15 seconds. Use a camcorder to tape the subject for 30-60 seconds then digitize the recorded image. Some new VCRs have a digital freeze frame which can be used. Most VCRs freeze are a little fuzzy- fuzziness will digitize also! Features include: * Plugs into Joystick ports (both)- no MPI needed! * Brightness & Contrast controls * * Color Burst Signal Filter * Images can be exported to Max-10, CoCo Max 3, and Color Max 3 * Resolutions of: 640x200 (16 gray levels with dithering), 640x200 (4 actual gray levels), 320x200 (16 colors), 320x200 (4096 colors). Did I mention it can do COLOR scans? These are more difficult than the normal black & white scans. Color requires taking three shots of the image, each with a separate color filter. The three images are then displayed in sequence 60 times/second to create a color image. A minor drawback to the system is that images are stretched a little horizontally, making people appear just a little "fatter". Nevertheless, the Rascan was hailed as "the best Color Computer digitizer" by Ed Eilers in the last Rainbow review (December 1990, page 83).
