It's here. The fantastic new TRS-80 Model 100 Portable Computer from Radio Shack. It's a truly portable computer that works anywhere on batteries—not another "transportable" with a handle and AC power cable. The Model 100 can fit in your in-basket and weighs less than four pounds, yet it's powerful enough to serve as your desktop microcomputer.

Model 100 has built-in features that let you write memos or reports, keep your appointments, address, phone list and expense records up-to-date, and provide instant data communication via telephone. It will even dial the phone for you.

A Workstation That Goes Along

Most personal computers are growing more complex, more expensive and large enough to require their own desk. We've designed the Model 100 to be simple, go with you, work the way you work, handle the things you have to do, and be extremely simple to use. And it works in a taxi, hotel, on a job site—virtually anywhere!

The Ultimate Travelling Companion

Suppose this Monday morning at the office you are using the TEXT program built into the Model 100 to draft your monthly report and clear up some business letters. At noon, you unplug your Model 100 from its optional AC power adapter, slip it into your briefcase and take a cab to the airport to catch a plane to New York.

In the taxi, you pull out your Model 100, check your schedule, and begin working on those letters. The computer runs on four "AA" batteries, and when it's turned off, the memory is supported by its own set of rechargeable batteries—so that information can be safely stored for up to 30 days.



Easy-to-Use Communications

Once in your hotel room, you plug your Model 100 into the phone line and press a few keys. The computer automatically dials the local phone number of a nationwide electronic mail service. You receive a message from your secretary and another from a West Coast colleague, sent only hours before. By sending the draft of a letter back to your secretary electronically, you can have a typed copy that's ready for your signature when you return to the office. You may also want to access Dow Jones News/Retrieval®, an information service that lets you check the latest stock market quotes, plus industry and financial news from *tomorrow's* headlines.

Instant Access to Important Data


At the briefing on Tuesday, the vice-president wants the early sales results from the new product. Nobody has had time to do much more than glance at them—except you, since you've been working on them in spare moments for the past two days. You call up your preliminary analysis on your Model 100 and show it to the vice-president, who's obviously impressed. Meeting notes go into the Model 100 as they happen.

Tuesday night, en route home, you use your Model 100 to review your notes, go over the material from your secretary and update your schedule with new "to-do's".

Staying Ahead of the Game

Back in the office Wednesday morning, there are no surprises waiting for you and you're not days behind in your work. The work you sent to your secretary is waiting for your signature. Putting your Model 100 back on your desk, you go through your updated Schedule, pick out the next item on your "to-do" list and begin taking care of it.

Going to New York was all in a day's work—a day's work that could have turned into a week's work if it hadn't been for your TRS-80 Model 100 Portable Computer. After using Model 100 for just a few days, you'll wonder how you ever got along without it!

Model 100's easy-to-read screen displays about one-third of a page in upper-and-lower-case characters. The 15,360 individually controllable picture elements can provide superb dot-matrix graphics. The liquid crystal screen even adjusts electronically for optimum visibility at any viewing angle.

Full-Size Typewriter Keyboard

You don't feel cramped because Model 100 has a full-size typewriter keyboard. It includes standard typewriter keys, six special keys, eight programmable function keys, four command keys and four cursor control keys. A "number" key even turns a section of the keyboard into a 10-key datapad. All 256 ASCII codes can be generated right from the keyboard, too.

Built-In Personal Word Processing

Your personal word processing program is built in, ready to use. It has "cut, copy and paste" functions to make editing a snap, plus fast and easy cursor movement, and a search function. And the function keys give you keystroke-quick response to menu items. With an optional printer, you can print any of your files in selectable widths (up to 132 columns) without splitting words.

Schedule and Address Book


Both are included in the built-in software. SCHEDULE turns the Model 100 into a mini-database for appointments, expenses, "to-do's" or any information you need to access quickly. ADDRESS keeps names, addresses and phone numbers. Both have a search function that will recall desired information at electronic speed.

Complete Telecommunications Package

Select TELCOM from the menu and Model 100 functions as a terminal via the built-in auto-dial modem or the RS-232 interface for computer-to-computer communications. This allows you to save or send text files with just a few keystrokes.

Built-In Modem

With an optional cable, you can plug your Model 100 into any modular phone jack to send or receive data over the phone lines! As a telephone auto-dialer, Model 100 will search your files and dial any requested number. You can set up an auto log-on function to reach information networks, like CompuServe® or Dow Jones, with just a couple of keystrokes. And you can add optional acoustic cups to use with telephone handsets when a phone jack is not available.





There's also an interface that lets you save or load programs, data and text at a fast 1500 baud using a standard cassette recorder.


